DISTINCTIVE FEATURES:

Custom gold grill on top and bottom teeth.
Heavy gold Cuban link chain worn at all times.

TATTOOS: "Most Hated" in script on the left side of his neck; "SNAKE" and "EYES" tattooed across his knuckles.

WANTED FOR: Grand Theft, Conspiracy, Breaking and Entering

CASE: The Treasure Hunt Amusement Park Heist (Las Vegas, NV)

DEMEANOR: Highly cocky, known for flashing an arrogant, evil grin even when cornered.

STATUS: AT LARGE

Larson is one of 14 primary suspects in the high-profile robbery of the Treasure Hunt Amusement Park in Las Vegas. The crew bypassed main security, broke into a restricted storage shed, and made off with highly valuable, heavily guarded items. The stolen loot was subsequently dispersed across the United States. Larson is believed to be in possession of at least one of these high-value items, using it to fund his current lifestyle.

MODUS OPERANDI & DISTINGUISHING TRAITS:

The Gambler: Larson is an avid, compulsive gambler. His game of choice is almost exclusively the craps table, where he routinely places massive, high-risk bets.

The "Fog": Suspect is rarely seen without a lit joint or blunt. Witnesses frequently report him walking through casino floors and parking garages enveloped in a thick plume of marijuana smoke.

LAST KNOWN MOVEMENTS:

Law enforcement and park security are currently tracking Larson's movements down the Florida coast. He is leaving a highly visible trail of cash and casino chips, clearly heading south:

North Florida: Spotted five days ago buying into a high-stakes craps game at a card room near Jacksonville.

Tampa, Florida: Spotted two days later on casino surveillance cameras, blowing through thousands of dollars and smoking heavily near the loading docks.

Pompano Beach, Florida: Most recent sighting.
