PROFILE:

Bob Lee was born into an affluent Southern family whose history extends back generations. Raised among wealth, private tutors, and prestigious schools, Lee demonstrated exceptional aptitude in mathematics, chemistry, engineering, and theoretical physics from an early age.

Military records indicate Lee enlisted in the United States Navy and was eventually assigned to an Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) unit supporting Special Operations. During his service, he developed a reputation as an exceptionally gifted technician capable of solving complex explosive problems under pressure.
