PROFILE: Subject is a proficient thief and cat burglar, suspected in several high-profile thefts totaling over one million dollars since 2006. Known associate of The No Name Gang.

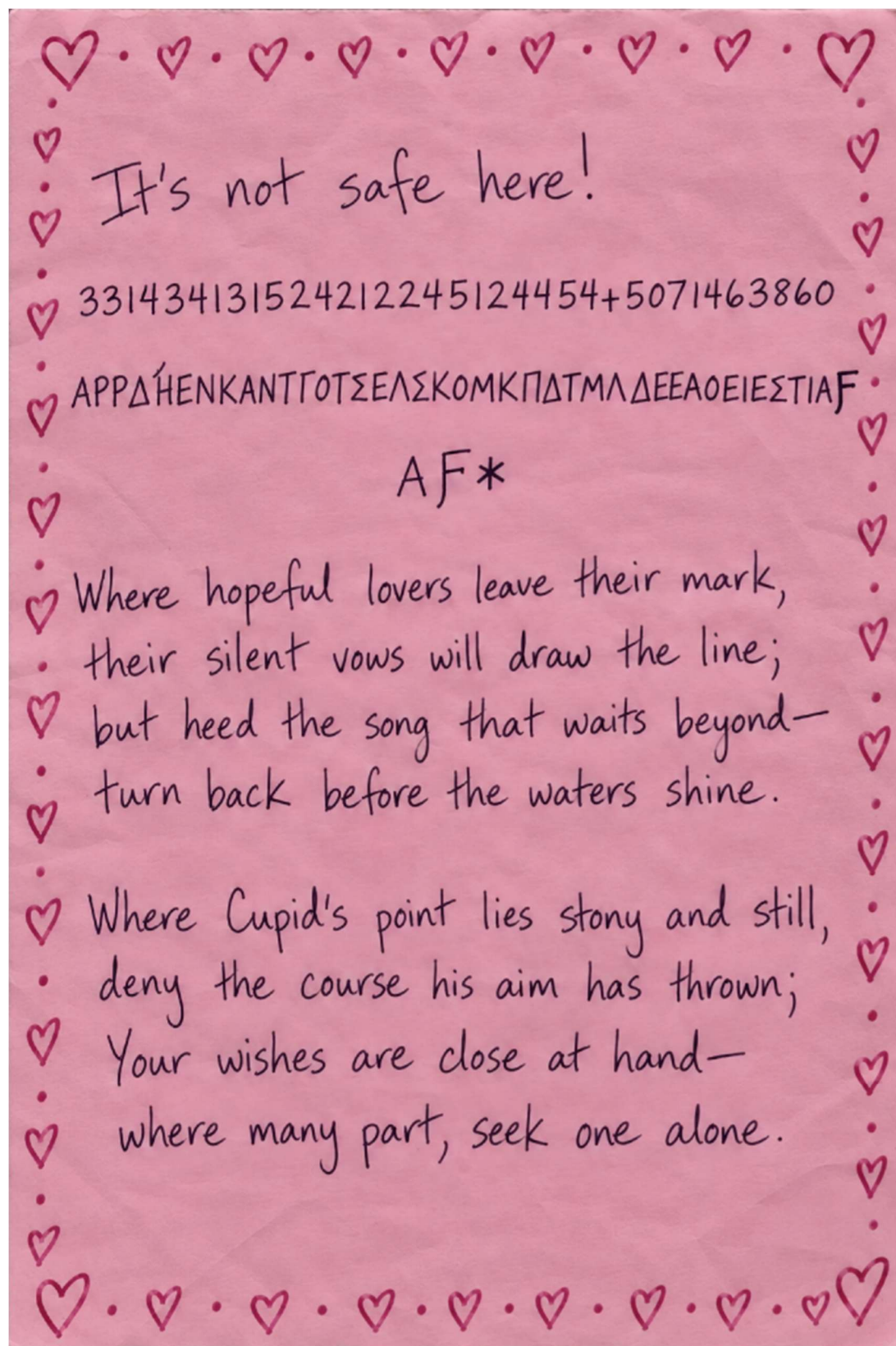
INCIDENT REPORT: On 09/01/2026 at approximately 0645 hrs, members of the Salt Lake City Police Department Fugitive Unit, with assistance from Uniform Patrol, executed the above referenced arrest warrant for suspect Cassy Nova in connection with the Treasure Hunt Amusement Park Heist that occurred in Las Vegas, NV on 08/15/2026. Information developed during the investigation indicated Nova was staying at the Siesta No Tell Motel, Room 17. Contact was made with the front office clerk who confirmed a female matching Nova's description was registered to Room 17 under the name "C. N." and had paid cash for multiple nights.

At 0645 hrs officers proceeded to Room 17, knocked, and announced, "Police Department, Search Warrant." No response was received. After repeated announcements, officers forced entry into the room. The room was unoccupied. A cigarette in the ashtray on the nightstand was still burning and smoke was present. Based on the condition of the cigarette and the room, it appears the occupant had left only moments prior to entry.

Officers conducted a protective sweep of the room, bathroom, and closet. No individuals were located. A search of the room yielded no property related to the Treasure Hunt Amusement Park Heist. No jewelry, gemstones, cash, or documents associated with the theft were located.

During the search, a framed print (Pablo Picasso reproduction) was located on the wall opposite the bed. A folded handwritten note was concealed behind the print, tucked between the frame and wall. The note appears to be written by the suspect and may contain information regarding her next destination or actions. The note was seized as evidence.

This note, photographed on the next page, is believed to be the key piece of evidence that could lead to the recovery of property stolen from The Treasure Hunt Amusement Park.



The room was photographed, documented, and secured. Motel management was advised.

Status: At Large

Last apprehended as a minor on 9/1/2007 for Grand Larceny. Minor report was unsealed to assist in the apprehension related to the major heist.

PROFILE INFORMATION
Subject is a repeat juvenile offender with a pattern of selective residential burglaries targeting affluent neighborhoods. Primarily steals high-value jewelry belonging to adult females. Does not appear motivated by financial need; items often kept rather than sold. Long history of instability, foster care, and attachment issues. Displays intelligence, manipulation, and lack of remorse. Exhibits fixation on marriage, wealth, and symbolic meanings of jewelry.

INTERVIEW EXCERPT (09/01/2007)
Det.: Why do you steal jewelry? Subject: Because they think it means somebody loves them. Det.: And you don't? Subject: Most of the time it's just a gift so they'll stay. It's fake love. Things aren't love. Det.: You've never met these women. Subject: I don't have to. Look at their houses. Look at what they wear. Det.: What do you do with the jewelry? Subject: Keep it. It's not about the money. Det.: Do you feel bad when they lose something that's important to them? Subject: If he really loved her, she'd still have him.

ASSESSMENT
Subject demonstrates compulsive stealing behaviors with a defined ideological justification. Views expensive jewelry as a symbol of superficial relationships and materialistic affection. Theft appears to provide a sense of control and retribution. Underlying issues include abandonment, resentment toward perceived privileged lifestyles, and a distorted view of love and worth. Capable of calculated planning; elevated risk of recidivism.

CONCLUSION
Subject remains a risk to the community and requires secure placement with specialized mental health and behavioral intervention. Continued monitoring recommended. Motivations are psychological in nature and extend beyond financial gain.

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Leads: Reported to still be in the Salt Lake City area after a confidential informant led police to her hideout at the Siesta Motel where evidence was collected.
